Dear students, faculty and staff,

the 7th edition of the „Studi-Compass“ shows the continuous development of RWU - University of Applied Sciences and the high commitment of its student body.

This commitment of the students to social, ecological and scientific issues in teaching, research, continuing education and student life is promoted by the Prorectorate for Didactics, Digitization and University Communication. This brochure provides an insight into the university's political structures and institutions, active student initiatives and associations, as well as important information about advisory services offered by the university. Students, faculty and staff at RWU enjoy helping and supporting one another. This is particularly evident in the volunteer work of the Weingarten First Responders. The First Responders Weingarten are a cooperative project of RWU together with the University of Education Weingarten (PH), the DRK local association Weingarten and the DRK district association Ravensburg. In time-critical emergencies, they act as on-site helpers, providing extended first aid to bridge the time until the emergency services arrive. They attend events at RWU and PH Weingarten and support the local DRK association at first-aid services and blood donations. Therefore in December 2020, the First Responders were awarded with the sponsorship prize of the Federal Ministry of the Interior, for Construction and Home Affairs (BMI).

The Formula Student Team Weingarten and its sponsors achieved a special feat under pandemic conditions with the construction of the racing cars Stinger 21 C and 21 D for the start of the racing season 2021. With the Stinger 21 D, the team will participate in Formula Student Combustion, a discipline for combustion engines. The driverless Stinger 21D was developed for the Driverless competition. In the racing season 2021, the team will participate in competitions in Austria, Spain and Croatia.

The student initiative Umwelt AG (environment AG) is campaigning for a sustainable and ecological future in everyday life with a wide range of activities. In May 2021, the Umwelt AG participated with an exciting and diverse program in the sustainability weeks of the universities in Baden-Württemberg. Since June 2021, for example, gardening enthusiasts have been planting fruits and vegetables in the first community garden F.A.I.R.-Beet at RWU's Welfen Campus. In addition, the Umwelt AG regularly holds campus clean-up events and bicycle repair days.

Interesting lectures are planned for the winter semester 2021 again. For example, as part of the Wednesday seminars, journalist Susana Santana, who works for ZDF, will report on her work on the topic „For a fair world - uncovering grievances with reports“.

You are all invited to participate in the events and to get involved in one of the numerous initiatives.

In this area we are working, among other things, on a project for intelligent building management in which we are evaluating the energy-saving potential that can be achieved through intelligent heating control in lecture halls.

Together with the Office of Supply and Construction, we are working on establishing beehives of the beekeepers' association on campus.

Furthermore, we support the further development of the Campuss app in order to sensitize students in a playful way to environmentally compatible behavior on campus. In the future, we also plan to integrate the topic of mobility to and on campus.

All projects that already incorporate the idea of sustainability are marked with the goals of the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development's Agenda 2030. This makes it clear which goals the initiatives are pursuing for a sustainable university.

Our university initiative of First Responders has been in existence since March 2002. The group includes about 30 students, staff and professors who are committed to the motto „Rescuing around the Campus“. We are alerted by the rescue control center in case of time-critical emergencies on and around campus. At the emergency scene, we bridge the time until the arrival of the rescue service by providing qualified effective first aid. We have an average of 60 successful first aid missions per year. In addition, we provide about 25 first-aid services per year, such as assistance at student parties, sporting events and graduation ceremonies.

Anyone can participate. We offer the necessary training to become a paramedic. Those who already have the training, you can start directly with day and ambulance services after you have registered with us. About every three weeks we meet for an advanced training organized by ourselves, where we secure and extend our knowledge on the basis of various exercise examples.

Helping people in emergency situations is our task. At the same time we attach great importance to a good group togetherness and meet regularly for joint leisure activities and lunch in the canteen.

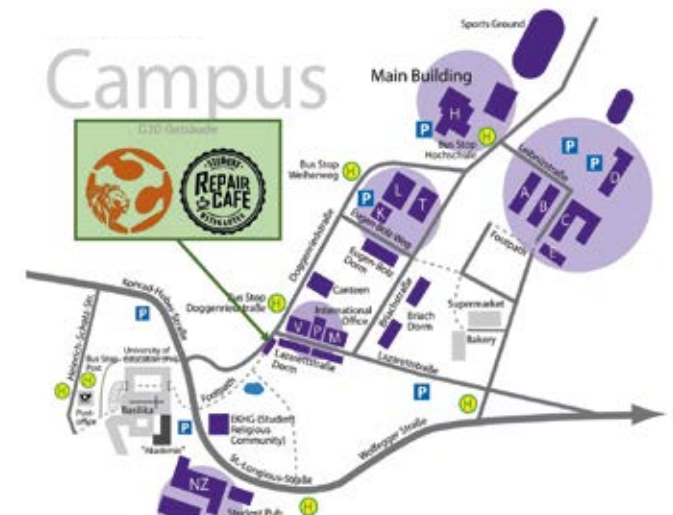

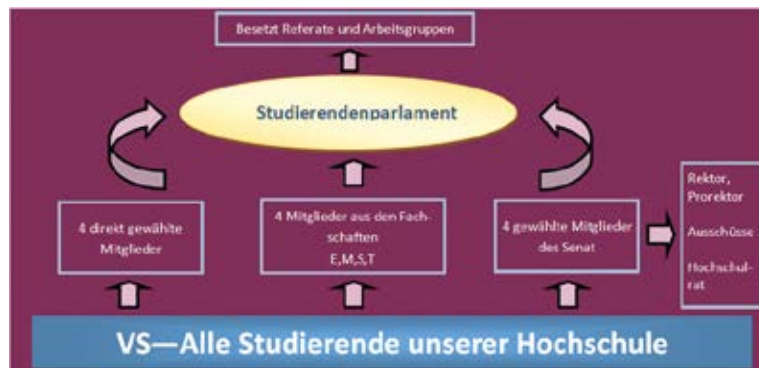
